



KNIGHTS AND CASTLES -A WINTER JOUST





We have shared the incommunicable experience of war. We have felt, we still feel, the passion of life to its top... In our youths, our hearts were touched by fire"

Private Edward Jemison Died at Malvern Hill, Va. aged 15

The Civil War was fought in 10,000 places, from Valverde, New Mexico, and Tullahoma, Tennessee, to St. Albans, Vermont, and Fernandina on the Florida coast. More than 3 million Americans fought in it, and over 600,000 men, 2 percent of the population, died in it.

American homes became headquarters. American churches and schoolhouses sheltered the dying, and huge foraging armies swept across American farms, burned American towns. Americans slaughtered one another wholesale, right here in America, in their own cornfields and peach orchards, along familiar roads and by waters with old American names.

In two days at Shiloh, on the banks of the Tennessee River, more American men fell than in all previous American wars combined. At Cold Harbor, some 7,000 Americans fell in twenty minutes. Men who had never strayed twenty miles from their own front doors now found themselves soldiers in great armies fighting epic battles hundreds of miles from home. They knew they were making history, and it was the greatest adventure of their lives.

On the weekend of April 17-18, 2021, your Scouts will have the opportunity to share this experience in "The Blue and Grey" - our district's Civil War themed Spring 2021 Camporee.

Once you've registered, your troop will be given information on a real Civil War regiment, so that the Scouts can get a feel for what the soldiers experienced during the War. If you have a preference for what side you'd like that regiment to be from, be sure to indicate it on the registration form.

At each station at the camporee, each patrol will compete against another patrol, as the Scouts have fun and learn about this defining moment in American history. Many stations will require your best Scout skills, others will reward Civil War military prowess or athletic ability. Still others will be just-for-fun games. There will also be non-competitive stations such as visits with Civil War re-enactors and a museum of artifacts. The day will end with a mass game and a big campfire. We'd like to have troops lead Civil War songs at the campfire - let us know if your troop is willing, and we'll send out a songsheet for you to choose from (or let us know if you already have a choice). If you'll need some help, we can provide an MP3 file or CD so your unit can learn the song.

Because of the nature of the event - we need to assign regiments, and need to have exactly the right number of stations - advance registration is required. Walk-ins at the camporee will not be permitted to participate. Pre-registration cards will be handed out at the October 2020 Roundtable, or can be downloaded from the District Website TCScouts.org Activities pagel Please send your reservation card to Mike Brown by e-mail at Camporee@TCScouts.org.

Scout Leaders: This Camporee has been held in ten councils, (that we know of) since it was first tried in 1993 at Camp Barton, 27 years ago . In April, it will all come together again. All we need is you! Your Scouts will have a great time at the camporee, but we can't do it without your help. We'll be asking leaders to help at the camporee to run stations or help with logistics.

14th Annual 10 Commandments Hike

November 27, 2020 - the Friday after Thanksgiving

The Baden-Powell Duty to God Committee is planning our fourteenth annual council-wide 10 Commandments Hike. Cub Packs, Scouts BSA Troops, Venturing Crews, Girl Scouts, Families of Scouts and Church Youth Groups are invited to attend.

What is a 10 Commandments Hike?

Participants meet at Ithaca Unitarian Universalist Church, register, and have one commandment explained by the pastor or pastor's designee. Then Scouts and others "hike" to each of 9 more houses of worship. A commandment will be discussed at each location and a little bit about the faith/denomination and parish/worship community will be explained. At the end of the hike participants will receive a 10 Commandments Hike patch, will be aware of Scout religious awards programs, and will have a basic understanding of the 10 Commandments.

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Where, When, How?

The hike will be among 10 different churches covering multiple denominations in and around Ithaca, NY. Check-in will begin at 9:30 AM at Ithaca Unitarian Universalist Church at 306 N Aurora St in Ithaca, NY. and the event will complete mid-afternoon. Routes among the 10 churches will be established for groups of Scouts & their families, or for youth groups according to age ranges of the youth participants. The total route is expected to be between 1 and 2 miles.

Cost?

\$7 for each participant or a \$25 family rate maximum.

Please bring a bagged lunch. Warm drinks and snacks will be provided about midway through the day.

Who?

The event is open to all Scouts, their families, and to area church youth groups. Most of our area's religions accept the moral teachings embodied in the 10 Commandments. All of our Scouting community will be welcome.



Join us for a virtual tour of the Everson Museum, focusing on symmetrical art works. We'll learn from a professional about the ideas of balance involved in this art.



National Training is available online through *my.scouting.org*, but the Training Committee schedules in-person and classroom training, including:

- University of Scouting
- National Training for Scouting Programs at all levels
- Outdoor Training for Cub Leaders (Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation, BALOO) and for Scouts BSA (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills, IOLS)
- Woodbadge (for adults) and National Youth Leadership Training, NYLT (for youth) are scheduled annually.
- OKPIK, Cold Weather Camping Training for adults and older youth, (scheduled every January)
- In-Person Youth Protection Training (available on request)
- Introduction to Leadership Skills (ILS) for Youth Leaders in Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scouts
- Wilderness First Aid (offered annually)

What does it take to be a Trained Leader?

All Registered BSA Members in the Baden-Powell Council are required to take Youth Protection Training (YPT) annually. You can take it online through *my.scouting.org*, at a scheduled classroom session (usually at Roundtable) or you can request a special session for your Unit.

Position-Specific Training is also required. Den Leader, Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor, Sea Scout Basic Adult Leader Training, Committee Chair, Committee Challenge (specific to Unit Type) and Merit Badge Counselor.

Outdoor Training: At least one Cub Leader must have Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO) to take Cubs camping and Adult Leaders for all other programs are required to take Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS).

Emergencies Happen and Unit Leaders should "Be Prepared". Basic First Aid, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), and Wilderness First Aid are available on a regular basis and can also be scheduled for your Unit. Please contact the Baden-Powell Council First Aid coordinators:

Advanced Leadership Training for Adults and for Youth is scheduled annually.

- Wood Badge: Advanced Leadership Development for ALL Adult Scouts, Unit Leaders, District and Council volunteers is offered annually in partnership with our neighboring Five Rivers and Longhouse Councils
- National Youth Leader Training (NYLT): An intense week-long leadership experience Scouts, Venturers, and Sea Scouts age 14 and up (or 13 and completed 8th grade) builds on basic ILS training (a prerequisite) and basic camping/outdoor cooking skills to teach leadership skills in a dynamic youthled environment. Participation requires the Unit Leader's recommendation.

Outdoor Adventure doesn't stop when the snow flies! OKPIK -- the BSA's Cold Weather Camping Training -- prepares you for safe and fun cold weather camping. This course is scheduled every January over two weekends. A day of classroom training and preparation is followed by a weekend outdoor experience where learned skills are applied and refined. Typically the classroom session is offered at the Council Service Center with the outdoor experience at Highland Forest in Tully, NY a week or so later.
