

Rev. Sidney Winter served on Camp Barton's staff during much of the 1930's – mid 1940's. He was the 6th individual to serve as Camp Director from 1941-1942. Rev. Winter was widely known across the region in Scouting and was a favorite of the Scouts he led. Rev. Winter was known for his sternness, his high expectations, and his

passion for the foundations of Scouting. The Sidney Winter Trail program exists to carry on not only his legacy, but the importance of the early ranks in Scouting and their contributions to each generation that carries the light forward. Sidney Winter Trail runs concurrently with Badges At Barton during select sessions. Scouts are enrolled into the program individually. Adult Volunteers are encouraged to partake in the leadership of this program.






